One In Christ

Human beings are natural wall builders. In the Church of Jesus Christ it must not be so. St. Paul wrote, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Gal. 3:28)

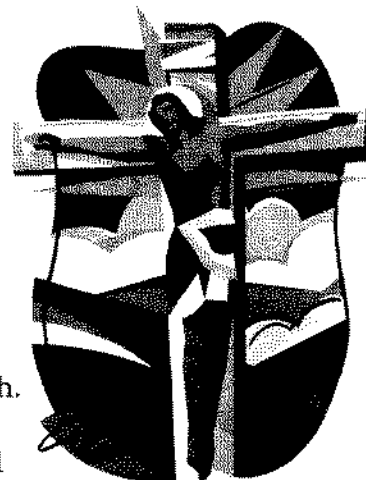
The unity of the church is not organizational, nor is it based on social or economic status or educational background. Men divide themselves over these matters and also attempt to find unity in these, which produces even greater disunity.

Christian unity is founded upon the reality that we have one Savior, and one faith in Him. We have been made a part of His body, the true Church, by the power of the Holy Spirit. We do not find in the New Testament a church for Jews who have accepted Christ and another for gentile believers or a church for slaves and another for free citizens. There is only one Church of Jesus Christ.

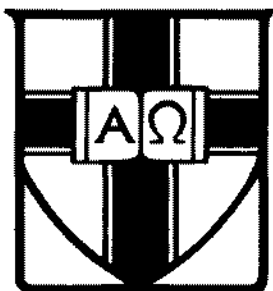
As we sadly know we Christians do not always experience this unity. How are we to develop and maintain unity in the Church?

First, we need to realize that unity is not something we produce. When man tries to create unity it is always based on something inadequate. We tend to base our unity on economic status, race, personality, or common interests. To do so is to build on sand.

Secondly, we must eliminate the causes of disunity. The main problem is human pride. The church of Corinth was a very divided church. Some thought they were superior to other Christians because they possess certain spiritual

gifts. They had forgotten that the gifts of the Spirit were given to be used to strengthen the whole church and not for individual honor. The humility which we see demonstrated in Christ will keep us united.

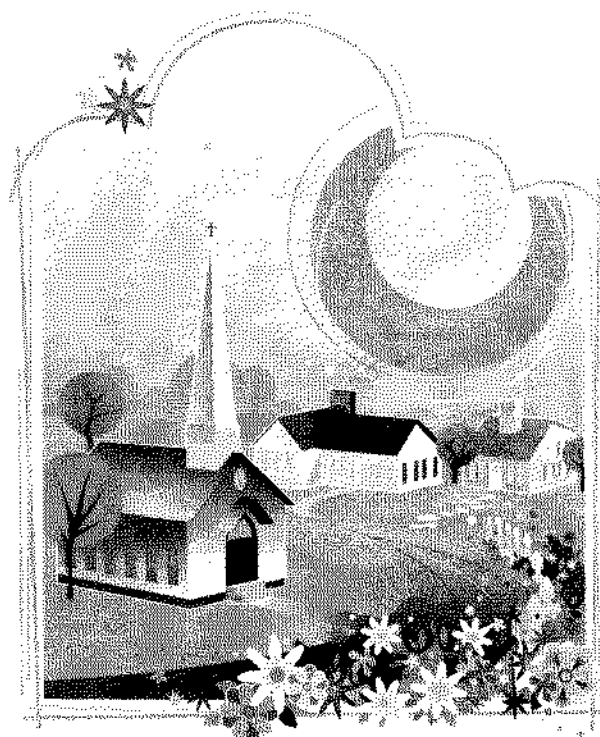
Thirdly, we need to recognize that some degree of diversity is not incompatible with unity. In writing to the Corinthians St. Paul compared the Church to the human body. The various parts of the body, such as eyes, ears, and feet are not identical but they possess a common life due to their connection to the body. A single eye or ear does not make a body.

Finally, we must always remember that our unity as the Church is in Christ. St. Paul did not tell the Corinthians, "I want you to become more united." Rather he emphasized to them that they were united in the one body of Christ through the one Spirit. We do not need to seek unity with other Christians, for it is already ours. What we must do is live out the implications of the unity that we actually have in Christ. In other words, we are united; now let's live together like we believe it.

The distinctions that so often form barriers among people are irrelevant in the Church of Jesus Christ. For, "In Christ neither circumcision prevaieth anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature." (Gal. 6:15) The "new creature" is all that matters.

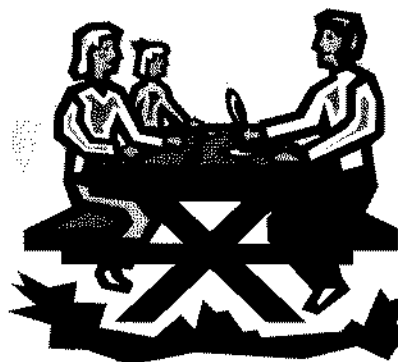

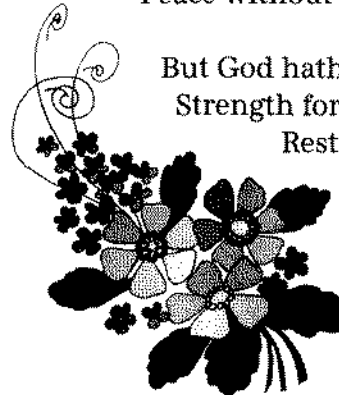
